# PREFERRED SUPPLIER OF FIRE PROTECTIVE COATING OR WRAPS FOR WOODEN POLES

#### **SECTION 1. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS**

#### 1. Scope of Bid

Energy Fiji Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Employer"), wishes to receive bids for supply of fire protective coating or wraps for Wooden poles as specified in these bidding documents. This tender can be a split award tender on a preferred supplier basis.

#### 2. Eligible Bidders

This Invitation to Bid is open to bidders who have sound financial background and have previous experience in supplying of fire protective coating or wraps for Wooden poles to Utilities. Bidder is requested to submit the supplier list.

Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility satisfactory to the Employer as the Employer shall reasonably request.

Bidders shall not be under a declaration of ineligibility for corrupt or fraudulent.

## 3. Eligible Materials, Equipment and Services

The Fire protective coating or mesh is to be supplied under the Contract shall have their origin from reputable companies from various countries. The bidders must provide evidence of the origin of the wrap or coating and its properties.

## 4. Qualification of the Bidder

To be qualified for award of Contract, bidders shall submit proposals regarding scheduling and resourcing which shall be provided in sufficient detail to confirm the bidder's capability to fulfil the contract.

#### 5. Cost of Bidding

The bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid and the Employer will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs.

#### Sealing and Marking of Bids

It is mandatory for Bidders to upload a copy of their bid in the TENDER LINK Electronic Tender Box no later than 1600hrs, Wednesday, 10th November, 2021.

#### 7. Deadline for Submission of Bids

Bids must be received by the Employer at the address specified above no later than 1600 hours (Fiji Time) (10<sup>th</sup> November 2021).

The Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission of bids by issuing an addendum, in which case all rights and obligations of the Employer and the bidders previously subject to the original deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadlines extended.

#### 8. Late Bids

Any bid received by the Employer after the deadline for submission of bids prescribed will be rejected and returned unopened to the bidder.

## 9. Modification and Withdrawal of Bids

The bidder may modify or withdraw its bid after bid submission, provided that written notice of the modification or withdrawal is received by the Employer prior to the deadline for submission of bids.

The bidder's modification or withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked and delivered, with the outer and inner envelopes additionally marked "MODIFICATION" or "WITHDRAWAL", as appropriate. A withdrawal notice may also be sent by email but must be followed by a signed confirmation copy.

No bid may be modified by the bidder after the deadline for submission of bids.

## 10. Employer's Right to Accept any Bid and to Reject any or all Bids

The Employer reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids, at any time prior to award of Contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders or any obligation to inform the affected bidder or bidders of the grounds for the Employer's action.

#### 11. Notification of Award

Prior to expiration of the period of bid validity prescribed by the Employer, the Employer will notify the successful bidder by email, confirmed by registered letter, that its bid has been accepted. This letter (hereinafter and in the Conditions of Contract called the "Letter of Acceptance") shall name the sum which the Employer will pay the Contractor in consideration of the execution, completion and maintenance of the Works by the Contractor as prescribed by the Contract (hereinafter and in the Conditions of Contract called "the Contract Price").

The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract.

Upon the furnishing by the successful bidder of a performance security, the Employer will promptly notify the other bidders that their bids have been unsuccessful.

## 12. Signing of Contract Agreement

At the same time that he notifies the successful bidder that its bid has been accepted, the Employer will send the bidder the Form of Contract Agreement provided in the bidding documents, incorporating all agreements between the parties.

Within 7 days of receipt of the Form of Agreement, the successful bidder shall sign the Form and return it to the Employer.

## 13. Corrupt or Fraudulent Practices

The Employer requires that the Contractor observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In Pursuance of this policy, the Employer:

- (a) defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
  - (i) "corrupt practice" means behavior on the part of officials in the public or private sectors by which they improperly and unlawfully enrich themselves and/or those close to them, or induce others to do so, by misusing the position in which they are placed, and it includes the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of any such official in the procurement process or in contract execution; and
  - (ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the Employer, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial noncompetitive levels and to deprive the Employer of the benefits of free and open competition;
- (b) EFL will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the bidder recommended for award has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for the contract in question.

## PREFERRED SUPPLIER OF FIRE PROTECTIVE COATING OR WRAPS FOR WOODEN POLES

#### 1.0 GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This tender is to purchase quality, durable and reliable fire protective coating or wraps which will be used to paint or cover wooden poles for the Energy Fiji Limited. The bidder's proposal shall address all specification and provide sufficient information and supporting documentation in order to determine compliance.

Wood poles are currently the preferred structure in power distribution and transmission in Energy Fiji Limited. Wood poles are heavily impacted by fire that is most often caused by other origins and usually non-fire treated wood poles are a utilities most impacted asset during a fire. Wood poles are still heavily used because of the lower cost of the asset as compared to alternative materials such as composite or steel poles.

A total of 4,632 wooden poles supports the 33,000 volts line in Energy Fiji Limited Network and all these poles are to be protected for security of power supply.

#### 2.0 TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

#### 2.1 FIRE PROTECTIVE WRAP

The Fire protective wrap will be used as a protective barrier to protect wood poles from burning and/or scorching causing significant strength loss in a wooden pole. It will allow Energy Fiji Limited to implement a fire resistant pole in high fire areas and is able to retain the positive qualities that are equivalent to the standard wood pole. It should be durable so it can be easily installed on existing poles by EFL's maintenance team. The Fire protective wrap must also be light weight and versatile and can easily be applied to existing structures.

The Fire protective wrap must form a barrier by expanding as soon as fire gets in contact or is near to the pole which will shield the wooden structure from radiant heat and fire. The wrap should allow the wood to breathe and maintain its homeostatic state. The wrap coating should expand in order to prevent ignition and does not lead to burnt pole.

The Fire Protective wrap must meet the following analysis:

- Safety
  - Pole is safe from wild fires and causes minimum to no interruption to the Network.
- Reliability
  - Quality of the Pole is enhanced
  - Minimal Inspection required
  - Fire Retardant (self-Extinguish)
  - Environmentally safe
  - Wraps to be made from a non-conductive fiberglass base material
  - Contains a material to assist in further reflecting heat
  - Have an infield service life of 20+ years
- Economics
  - No impact to maintenance and inspection cost
  - No impact to installation cost
- Application
  - Fire protective wrap to be from ground level to approx. 1.5m to 2m above ground level.
  - It must be easily installed by not more than 3 personnel.

#### 2.2 FIRE PROTECTIVE COATING

The Fire protective coating must be of simple application with compact airless equipment on or offsite which can be run from a small generator, also be applied by a brush or roll if repaired. The fire protective coating must be of a high performance exterior grade water based, fast drying, and spray able coating for use on Energy Fiji Limited's Wooden Poles.

The Fire Protective Coating must meet the following analysis:

- Safety
  - Pole is safe from wild fires and causes minimum to no interruption to the Network.
  - A breathable coating allows vapor transfer and stops moisture being trapped behind the coating stopping any chance of rot or loss of adhesion.

#### Reliability

- Quality of the Pole is enhanced
- Minimal Inspection required
- Fire Retardant (self-Extinguish)
- Environmentally safe
- Coating must be of nonhazardous water based coating with easy application.
- A customized mobile spray system allows for efficient application in field or in yard allowing for high volumes to be coated quickly and consistently.
- Have an infield service life of 20+ years

#### Economics

- No impact to maintenance and inspection cost
- No impact to installation cost

#### Application

- A customized mobile spray system allows for efficient application in field or in yard allowing for high volumes to be coated quickly and consistently.
- Coating to be applied from ground level to approx. 1.5m to 2m above ground level.
- The Fire protective coating must be easily applied by not more than 3 personnel.
- Simple touch up application process for inspection of holes or damaged areas on the pole.
- 2 coating thickness to cater for moderate or high risk threats.

#### 3.0 TRAINING OF EFL PERSONNEL'S

Bidder is required to training EFL personnel's, approx.; 30 people after award on the application of Fire Coating or Wraps and continue these training on annual basis.

**Note:** For companies registered offshore, a withholding tax of 15% will be deducted from the training component and for companies registered in Fiji, a 5% provincial tax will be deducted by EFL on training component. Bidders are requested to submit their prices accordingly.

#### 4.0 QUALITY AND ENVIRONMENT ASSURANCE

The quality assurance system of design, manufacture, and inspection shall conform to ISO 9001.

Quality assurance certificate according to ISO 9001 issued by an authorized inspection agency shall be submitted with the bid.

The environment management system of manufacture shall confirm to ISO 14001.

Environment assurance certificate according to ISO 14001 issued by an authorized inspection agency shall be submitted with the bid

Bids will not be considered if the manufacturer's experience or quality assurance system does not meet the above requirements.

Bidders must provide test certificates and a sample which will be used by the Technical team to access the fire protective coat or fire mesh at no cost charged to Energy Fiji Limited.

#### **5.0 INFORMATION TO BE SUPPLIED**

The following information shall be supplied with the offer:

- a) Bidders FNPF Compliance (Local Companies)
- b) Bidder TAX compliance certificate (Local Companies)
- c) Business Registration
- d) FNU Compliance Certificate (Local Companies)

#### **6.0 DEMONSTARTION**

Shortlisted bidders will be required to demonstrate the application and testing of Fire Protective Coating or Wraps. All application and testing related costs shall be borne by the bidder.

- Provision of insurance policies Public Liability

#### For Companies Registered Offshore

• A Withholding Tax ("WHT") of 15% will be deducted by the employer on the service component before making the payment to the contractor. The employer (EFL) will provide to the Contractor a WHT deduction certificate for any WHT deducted by the Employer, where applicable.

#### 7.3 INCOTERMS

 All pricing shall be done on Cost, Insurance and Freight (CIF) basis, delivered to Energy Fiji Limited's Navutu Depot, Lautoka, Fiji.

#### 7.4 CURRENCY

• All pricing shall be in either: US\$, AU\$, NZ\$, FJ\$.

#### 7.5 TAXATION

• The pricing shall be EXCLUSIVE of any type of taxation that needs to be paid in Fiji.

#### 7.6 PRICE BREAKDOWN

• The prices quoted will be fixed and NOT variable. The price schedule must be typed and not hand written. Hand Written Tenders will be disqualified.

#### 7.7 VALIDITY

■ The pricing shall be valid for 90 days

#### 8.0 DELIVERY

The bidder is to state the estimated time of delivery from issue of purchase order. Maximum allowable delivery time to be 14 weeks from issue of Purchase Order.

#### 9.0 WARRANTY

The bidder is to also state warranty details and submit in their tender submission. The required warranty period is five -ten (5-10) years from the date of fire protective coat applied or Fire proof wraps installed or bidder may state otherwise.

#### **10.0 PRICE VALIDITY**

The prices must be valid for a minimum of 3 months from date of close of tender. In exceptional circumstances, EFL may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing.
